Published in several formats dependent on year:

1972-1993 Microfiche and Paper (shelved in Periodicals under American Society of Agricultural Engineers, then Papers, or Transactions, etc)

1993-1996 Microfiche only

1997-2000 CD ROM (loaded on the CD ROM computer by the paper indexes at Magrath) only

2001-2002 Online at www.asabe.org (choose "Technical Library," and no login is needed) and Microfiche

2003-current Online only at www.asabe.org (choose "Technical Library," and no login is needed)

The paper indexes at Magrath are the schedule of the papers presented (no full text) but can give you the paper number which you need to find them in the various forms.

You can also search online for the paper number.

Online Databases: Agris, Agricola, and CAB Abstracts

A paper number will look like this 00-11234

The first two digits are the year it was presented, and then the next four digits are the paper number.

If a volume and page numbers are cited (some papers are published this way instead of being given a paper number), then it will be printed in the paper volumes shelved in Periodicals (1969-2005).

Paper copies of Technical Papers (1979-1993) will be organized by year and then region. There will still be a paper number (ex. 103) but there will be a region code before it (ex. PNW, SWR, or MC), so it will look like this PNW 103. The papers are in numerical order within the year and region code.

To find papers on the CD ROM go to the CD ROM computer in Magrath back by the paper indexes and maps. There are multiple disks per year, but each one will list all the papers for that year and which disk they are on, so if you choose the wrong one, close the program and open the correct one. The easiest way to find a paper is to click on “search papers” and then click on the binoculars icon, and search by author, title, or paper number (if you know it). To open the paper, click on the title and then you can save or print it.

To find papers on the website, go to www.asabe.org and click on “technical library” right below the login (you do not need to login to use the database). Then you can search by author, title, keyword, number, etc. Download the PDF to make sure all the images are included when you print.
